- Pastor's Message -

On July 19, 1952, the 12th occurrence of the modern Olympics took place in Helsinki, Finland. A total of 395 medals of gold, silver, and bronze, were awarded to competitors who achieved first, second, or third place in their respective events. Whoever said second place is the first loser must not have gone home with new jewelry.

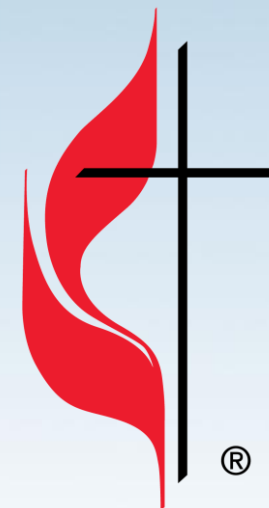
As I reflected on the number of medals, I started to think of all the athletes who did not medal, which must have totaled many multiples more than 395. These athletes committed most of their lives to training for their events and went home empty handed on the world's biggest stage.

Yet some perspective may be in order here. These many athletes went home empty handed but they were the best of the best from their homelands. They made it to the world's biggest stage. They earned no medals but their presence in the Olympics was an accomplishment in itself.

Second Timothy, written likely by an anonymous author in Paul's name, says, "I have fought the good fight. I have finished the race. I have kept the faith." We may see Paul's life, how he spread the gospel across the Roman empire and think, "I/we could never measure up to that."

Yet the measure is faithfulness, not our metrics compared to Paul's. Paul instructs "Proclaim the message (of God's reign); be persistent whether the time is favorable or unfavorable; convince, rebuke, encourage, with the utmost patience in teaching...always be sober, endure suffering, do the work of an evangelist, carry out your ministry fully."

Friends, let us commit to the ministry of sharing the good news of the Reign of God and loving God and neighbor. We do not have to be like Paul. It is simply about running the race and never quitting.
