- Pastor's Message -

Mainline churches, along with churches of all traditions, are, frankly, in decline. The past several decades, we have been losing far more people than we have been adding disciples to our churches. There are numerous reasons often given for this decline. Some believe churches became too judgmental. Others say churches became too political. Still, others say churches stopped appealing to or failed to listen to young people. Others have noted the fact that our young members are more mobile and move to new locations so there is not the natural passing on of our church to the next generation.

What's most important, though, is asking, "How do we turn around this trend of decline?" When we ask this question, we often "discuss" which programs or events will best draw people to the church. Or we "discuss" the merits of traditional, contemporary, or blended worship. We may want to rewind to the good old days of how we used to do church. Or we may want to scrap everything and start over. There are elements of each of these that can certainly benefit churches in their ongoing mission. Yet there is something vitally more important to connecting with new people as a church and it is perhaps the one thing that has faded from the practice of local churches more than anything else: personal invitation.

Studies repeatedly show that the number one reason people become involved in a church long term is that they were invited by a friend or family member. The number has bottomed out over the years at 85% of people who joined a church joined because of such an invitation. It has reached as high as the low 90's in percentage depending on the study. Notice one thing: it is the result of the invitation of a friend or family member. It is relational. It is not because the pastor is cool, though a cool pastor like me (give me a moment while I pause for laughter) may help people stick. It is not because the worship is awesome, though that can help connect with people once they are in a church. It is because of a personal invitation.
