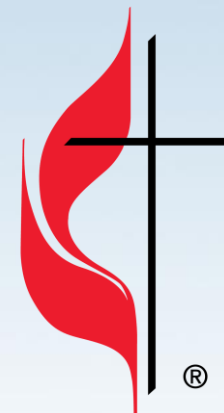

– Pastor's Message –

Last week, I shared with you that 85% of folks who become involved with a church do so because they were invited by a friend or family member. At that percentage, you can see that there is not a lot of room left for impact from mass mailings, spam emails, Facebook posts, or even door-to-door contacts. Reaching new people and making disciples for Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world occurs through relationship.

Sometimes, we reach a point in life where almost all of our friends are part of our church or some other church. When we are at this point, it is important to build new relationships of trust that may bear fruit over time while noting we are not building these relationships for the good of our local church but because we know the love of Christ, know how it has touched our lives, and we are called to share this good news because there are other people for whom the good news of God's love is just what they need. If we share this love with others, the good of the local church will be a byproduct of our witness.

So, how do we meet new people? Many may be next door. We probably all have neighbors we have not yet gotten to know on our street or our block. When the opportunity arises, introduce yourself. Think about where people gather. The new dog park. The youth sports, plays, and other activities in which the young people in our church participate. City events. The Star Center for you ice skaters. Even our own church events.

Speaking of church events, you can meet new people through the Project Transformation after school program and the upcoming Community Party. You may be thinking, "But a number of the folks who attend those programs are Hispanic and speak Spanish. I do not know Spanish." But the reality is you do not need to know Spanish. If you can come to the church about 5:45 pm Monday through Thursday and open doors for Project Transformation parents with a smiling face and a, "Hello," or even, "Hola," it will help build our relationships with the families involved. If you can come serve hot dogs, drinks, and the like at the Community Party, in the same manner it will also help build those relationships.

In a time where, culturally, barriers are being put up between different groups of people, trust is hard to win. Put yourself in the shoes of a Hispanic family here in our Chapel Hill circle. Your experience and the news you hear is full of white people and others, even those who identify as Christian, saying quite loudly that you are not welcome here. You hear stories of the intentional steps that are being taken to make you leave or break up your family. It seems nice that the predominantly white church net to your child's school has a Hispanic ministry. But can you be sure it is safe?

This is a barrier for which, perhaps, many of us are not directly responsible, but it exists. For others we meet in the above mentioned opportunities for relationship building, they have been emotionally burned by a church. Or they have heard reports of the hateful things that some Christians say and do. Or they have heard about the more stringently exclusive church polity regarding LGBTQIA persons passed by United Methodists at General Conference 2019. These are their barriers to trust. There's good news here, however. The posts that hold up such barriers crumble under the weight of love.

Chapel Hill United Methodist Church knows that love. CHUMC has that love. Let's share that love with our neighbors so that the barriers to the church will crumble.
