Jim Hanigan Building Manager In 2nd Corinthians 3, Paul speaks of the ministry of the Spirit that comes in a greater glory than the ministry of death. The ministry of death, represented the law of Moses and in Paul's mind, it was a ministry of condemnation. The law of Moses carried a certain glory in that it reveals the sinfulness of humanity in that we as humans, individually and collectively, are unable to fulfill every element of the letter of the law. It reveals our brokenness. Thus the letter, the ministry of death, leaves us condemned if we stop there.

The ministry of the Spirit is, however, life. The ministry of the Spirit is the ministry of justification rather than condemnation. It offers grace to us in our sin so that through faith we may be transformed, individually and collectively. This ministry of the Spirit sets us free from condemnation by God's grace. It reveals a God who is not seeking to condemn us, but a God of love seeking to renew us. It shows a God who is setting us free from the condemnation and shame of the rulers of the world.

During this first week of Advent, we embrace the ministry of the Spirit bringing justification by grace through faith because it is the hope for a world broken by condemnation. We can only view someone as enemies or as less worthy than us through eyes of condemnation. But once God's grace of justification is revealed to us to assure us we are not condemned, how can we ever look on anyone else with eyes of condemnation? Instead, we look, contrary to the ways of this age, on our neighbor with eyes of justification, for we know offering this grace we have received from God to our neighbors is how this hope for the world spreads.

This does not remove accountability for the harm we cause or mean harm should never be called out and confronted, but it offers hope beyond the harm caused and the brokenness of this world. No longer will we operate with eyes of condemnation because someone is poor or has not achieved wealth and power. No longer will people be looked down upon because of their race or gender. No longer will we take advantage of people because they are weaker, making it easier to claim God gave us power over them and their resources. No longer will we shame our neighbors out of a sense of self-righteousness and some sense that God wants us to force our beliefs upon our neighbor through systems of belief such as Christian Nationalism.

Instead, our lives will be lives of grace. Lives of the Spirit. Lives of embrace rather than hostility. Lives of charity and justice. Lives in which we recognize the Godgiven worth in all of our neighbors who have all been created in the image of God. Lives that recognize that the "Spirit is the Lord" who continually reveals new things to us to set us free more each day from condemnation. Lives of justification.

During this Advent, this ministry of the Spirit is our hope.

Communion Offering


The Communion Offering on December 4th will help provide holiday care packets for our homebound members.
