During this third week of Advent, we give thanks for the promise of joy as we encounter despair or circumstances that threaten to produce despair within us.

It seems, in the United States, that our bubble burst on September 11, 2001. Terrorists attacks. Warfare. Global Tensions. Racial Tensions. Recessions. Inflation. Injustice. Inequality. Pandemic. Contentious, even hate-filled, politics and elections. While it is not the first time our nation or this world have seen such turmoil, the times certainly changed rather suddenly and dramatically after a period of relative calm and security.

Add to that any personal, family, and communal drama and trauma, financial struggles, illness and injury, and other uncertainty inducing circumstances, and it can be hard to feel joyful or know where to find joy. With such struggles in mind, Hebrews reads:

"Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of our faith, who for the sake of the joy that was set before him endured the cross, disregarding the shame, and has taken his seat at the right hand of the throne of God"

Jesus knew the road of faithfulness would not be easy, but he continued on the path, knowing the result of faithfulness would be joy. We, too, can embrace the promise of joy as we seek to follow faithfully. Circumstances change and we are not promised that all will be well throughout our lives. But if we push on in the faithfulness of love, if we will embrace the weightier matters of justice and mercy and faith, we will find our way to days ahead and to the final day of Christ's return and we know the truth of the Psalms that, "Weeping may last for the night, but joy comes in the morning.
