In last week's newsletter I provided a summary of Bishop Ruben Saenz, Jr.'s sermon from his installation on February 19. In that sermon he shared, "I am excited about our church's future and our mission because of our amazing clergy and laity, our message of God's grace and our concern and commitment for personal holiness, evangelism, service in the world, and social justice," before laying out the five points of emphasis in his vision for the Central and North Texas Conferences. I summarized those points last week and will flesh those out over these next weeks..

The first point of emphasis was: we will engage those who have been left behind by society so that they know God sees them, hears their cries, cares for them, and draws near to them through ministries of church planting, spiritual formation, compassion, mercy, and justice.

Many people and people groups are simply ignored, overlooked, neglected, or dehumanized by the overarching powers that be. They do not have equal access to resources and opportunities that others may have. The circumstances into which they were born leave them not only in the batter's box hoping to find a way on base, they have a long shot to even make the proverbial team to get into the batter's box and may not even be invited to the tryout. Perhaps a people group is new to a community and that community is slow to recognize they have different needs and desires than those who resided in that community before. There are many ways in which we can seek to build community that includes those left behind.

Churches and churches-within-churches are being planted in growing areas and into areas with population shifts, such as Farmers Branch which now has the largest segment of its population represented by our Hispanic neighbors. We were starting toward this in 2019 before the pandemic disrupted those efforts, though we shall still seek to build a local church that reflects the community in which we live. Many of our neighbors, new and old, believe in God or sense the divine is out there and need a community that will help form them spiritually and connect them with God's grace. As we build new relationships in our community we can be guides along the way. People in our communities are suffering from grief, a lack of mental health, poverty, a lack of community, and oppression. Compassion will move us to build loving relationships in which we get to know them and their needs as we walk in ministry with them rather than assuming what they need. This compassion will result in movements in mercy in which we seek to help fulfill our neighbors' most pressing daily needs and movements of justice in which we seek to lovingly reshape ecclesial, political, economic, and social structures so that justice, equity, diversity, and inclusion become realities in place of the systemic issues that play a major role in creating the pressing daily needs we serve with our acts of mercy.

God sees us, hears our cries, cares for us, and draws near to us. In response to God's grace, may we share this with all our neighbors.
