In today's political climate, politicians and political commentators sometimes refer to the groups who follow their political opponents as sheep. This pejorative is used to discredit and dehumanize folks as mindless followers who accept what the politicians they support say without any critical thought. This lead in may seem partisan but it is really not as it seems. Political parties may use different types of language, but they all have their own language for achieving this discrediting and dehumanizing purpose.

**Pastor's Message** 

Jesus, however, uses the image of sheep differently. Sheep are those who know the Good Shepherd and know that they can trust him. In the Ancient Near East, shepherd imagery pointed to rulers and others with power whose call it was to care for the community of people over whom they governed. In the prophets, God judged their shepherds based on if they actually cared for the sheep in their "pasture" or abused them while seeking their own self-interest and unjust gains in power and finances.

As we consider this, we may be tempted to look at this through the lens of our own modern day political loyalties and crown those we support as faithful shepherds. However, if Jesus is the Good Shepherd, this suggests we may need a more discerning eye that moves beyond our own political biases. After all, Jesus as the Good Shepherd is the one we can trust and is nonpartisan. The loyalties Jesus has is the peace and well-being of all humanity. It points us beyond today's political polarization while pointing us toward engagement with the political realities of our world. We trust in Jesus, the Good Shepherd, and bear witness to Jesus so more sheep will hear and recognize his voice and learn to trust the Lamb of Love. We focus, not on political rancor, but on the weightier matters of the law: justice, mercy, and faith (Matt. 23:23). These weightier matters of the law are rooted in the love of God and neighbor. These matters are a call to us as disciples to be at work in the social arena for the transformation of the world on behalf of the suffering and oppressed. We trust the Good Shepherd will be with us no matter the risk or sacrifice. We may engage with politicians yet recognize that it is the voice of Christ whom we can trust.

The Good Shepherd calls our name. May we recognize that voice and follow in trust.
